Myself and PCSO Clive Wherry have been dealing with ongoing ASB being caused by a group of youths accessing a derelict site on Polmorla Road which has been causing issues to residents at the neighbouring properties. We

have been doing regular foot patrols around the area and have managed to track down the person responsible for the site who have now managed to secure the site. This seems to have improved things but we will continue to monitor.

The Wadebridge neighbourhood team will be in attendance at the upcoming Padstow Community Day on the 14/09/2024 and I will be attending to talk to members of Port Isaac Army Cadets on the 26th September."

On Wednesday 31st July an application was heard at Bodmin magistrates Court for a Partial Closure Order in relation to a property in BODMIN.

This property has become a significant source of anti-social behaviour that is having a massive impact on nearby residents. This order now makes it an offence for anyone (other than the resident) to enter. This is in place for 3 months.

This result has come through excellent partnership working and intelligence from the community.

This is one of several closure orders we have secured to reduce Anti-Social behaviour on residents in Bodmin.



From 24 September, it will be illegal to own a zombie-style knife or zombie-style machete.

More proactive work!

Police witnessed a male walk past them on St Marys Road around 4pm, near Fair Park smoking cannabis.

When challenged, the male ran from police who gave chase and with the assistance of a local taxi driver (who provided a free fare to police) police were able to safely detain and search the male. The male, who was 19 years old, was found in possession of a knife, drugs, scales and a second phone and was arrested. This male was remanded in police custody and charged by CPS where he is due to appear in court today. Oh and he was also wanted by the courts in Coventry for possession of a knife last month!

Bodmin Police utilised our Neighbourhood Support Team.

Specially trained officers in plain clothes located a female on her bike yesterday in Bodmin.

She was detained and searched. A quantity of Class A was located, and she was arrested for 'Possession with intent to Supply'. She has since been bailed. We also seized her bike for good measure

More proactive work! A package was seized at the Post office containing Drugs.

Bodmin Neighbourhood Police then attended this address and arrested the female on suspicion of



"attempt possession of controlled substance". A further search of the property discovered a significant quantity of Class A drugs. A further male was arrested at the address.

We did warn individuals that if they continued to try and purchase drugs on the internet that they would be arrested!
